







The first phase of the Action to Beat Coronavirus in Canada study—Ab-C—is now complete, including analysis of the blood samples and correlating the lab results with responses to the survey.

Here's what we found about the first wave of Canada's coronavirus pandemic:

The bottom line is that about 2% of the samples were positive for COVID-19 antibodies, signaling infection during the first viral wave from April to August 2020.

In most respects, the Angus Reid Forum members who participated are similar in health profile to the overall Canadian population, so 2% is a reasonable estimate for nationwide infection prevalence through September 1, or up to 1 million adult infections.

This places Canada among the lowest national rates early in the pandemic, which ranged from about 1% in Iceland to 9% in the US.

Angus Reid Forum members completed the Ab-C online survey between May and September.

9,064

of those members also sent self-collected dried blood spot (DBS) samples to the Unity Health researchers in Toronto, and these were tested for antibodies to SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19.

Looking at the results in detail, we find:



18-39

The 18–39 year-old age group (the youngest group in the study) had a slightly higher prevalence than older groups.



Ontario had the highest prevalence rate, followed by Quebec. British Columbia, and the Atlantic provinces had the lowest rates.

Pairing lab and survey results produces some interesting findings:

- People who reported symptoms were likely to have a positive blood antibody test.
- About 30% of those with positive blood antibody tests did not report symptoms—suggesting that asymptomatic infections are common.

A manuscript with all the results from 2020 is currently under review at a major medical journal. We'll alert you when it is published. You can also see a video of the results **HERE**.
